This collection of short stories is based on the author's observation of Australian youth growing up in the second half of the Twentieth Century. Several are set in the Kerang region in the 1950s and 60s. The stories actually trace the changes in Australian society over the decades from country towns to urban society. School settings play an important role in many of the stories. The unifying theme of the collection is growth in cultural, emotional, physical, psychological and spiritual stages through adolescence childhood. adulthood. They are filled with iconic characters such as Whacko Murray the Rabbitoh, Sr. Tarcissius who tames the unruly Mallee Boys to sharp shooting larrikins who wreak havoc on Annie Butler's poultry farm. There are also insights into the romantic dreaming of teenage girls and the annual rituals of Deb Balls.
